For the last two years, Clare regularly volunteered with the RSPB's School Outreach program, as well as the Avon Gorge and Downs Project, where she worked as part of school educational teams to deliver engaging nature-themed activities to children, both in the classroom and outdoors. She also worked as a PASS (Peer Assisted Study Sessions) Leader for her University, where she played a key role in easing the transition of a group of younger undergraduate students into higher years, through planning and leading weekly study and revision sessions, as well as providing advice and support to them. These experiences greatly increased her confidence as an educator and leader, and she enjoyed working independently and

creatively. It was also rewarding for her to see how her sessions made a positive contribution to student's learning progress and formed a more interactive part of their education.

During her A-Levels, Clare volunteered on a weekly basis in an after-school homework club as part of a local community project, where she helped develop the spelling, reading and mathematical skills of school children by working in 1:1 sessions with them to focus on students' individual needs. In this project, she regularly monitored their development, recording comments in their progress book, and used a positive reward system for good work and behaviour.
